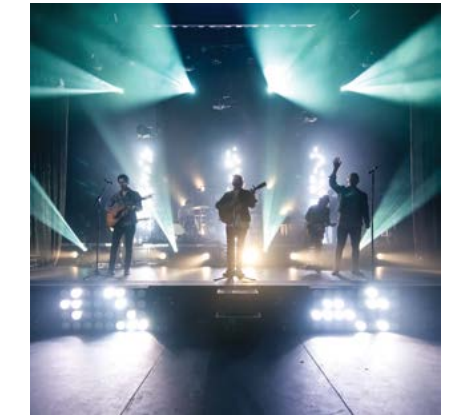
CHAPEL

THAILAND

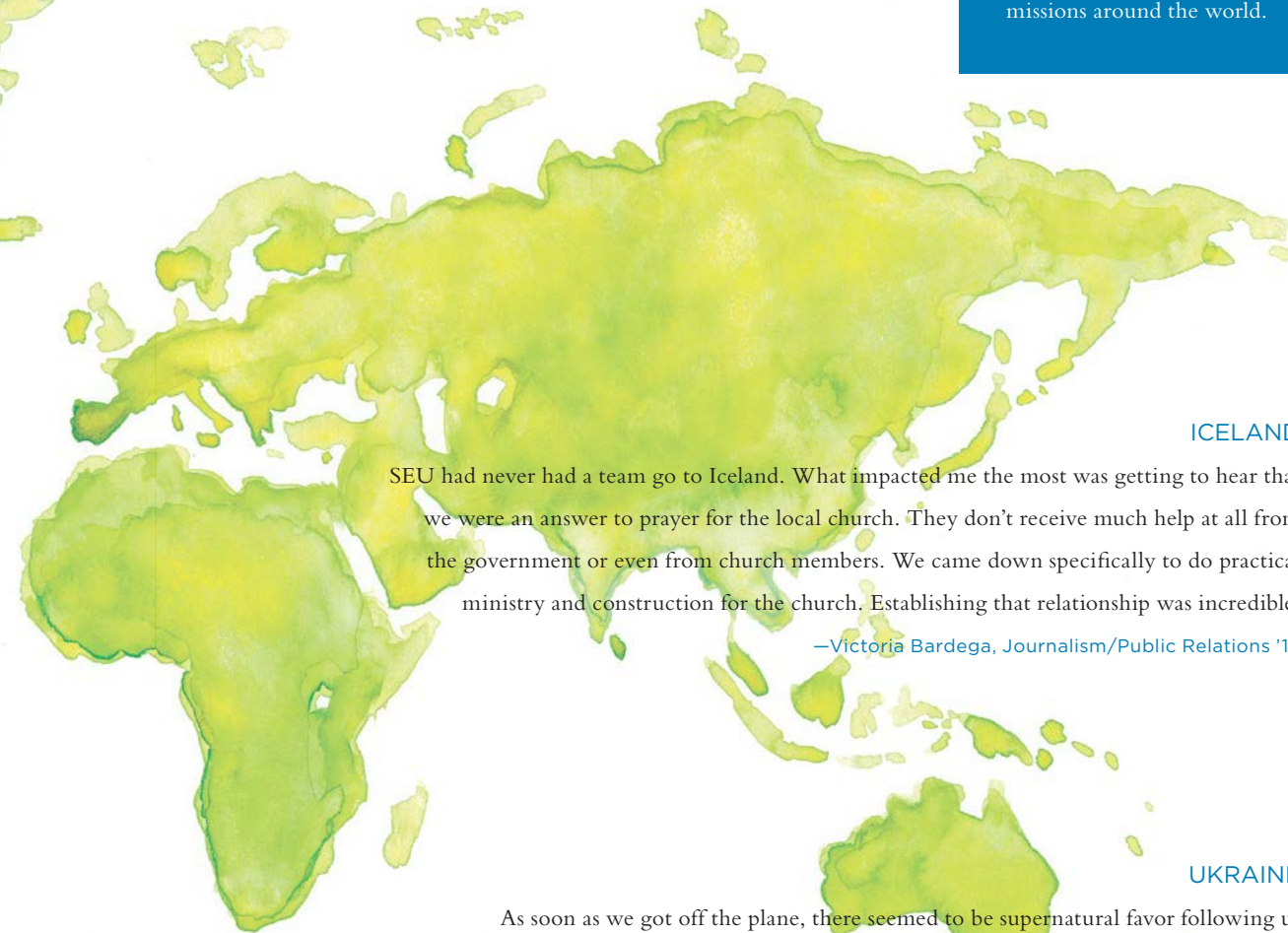

ICELAND

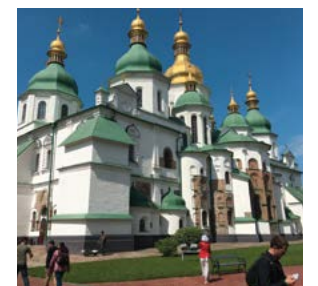

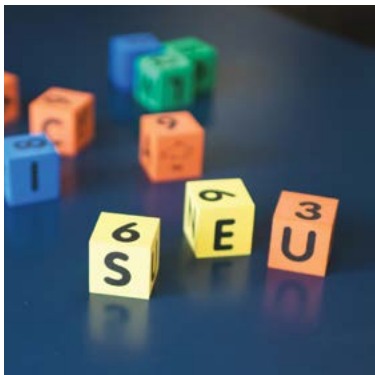


MEET THE WILKERSONS

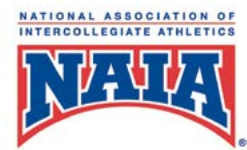
MEET CHRISTIN STRAWBRIDGE
