## MANAGING YOUR FINANCIAL INFO ONLINE



## WHAT IS THE STUDENT INFORMATION SHEET?

Each year, Southeastern University students must fill out the Student Information Sheet (SIS). This important step, which takes on average about 1–2 minutes to complete, allows SEU's Office of Student Financial Services to confirm your eligibility for many of your financial aid awards. Failure to complete the SIS each year may prevent disbursement of financial aid and could result in late fees for any unpaid balance — be sure to submit yours today!



## BENEFITS OF COMPLETING THE SIS

In addition to ensuring that you receive your financial aid funds on time, completing the SIS enables SEU's student financial services team to do the following:

- Determine your eligibility for other potential financial aid opportunities
- Meet state and federal requirements to allow payment of any financial aid you've already been awarded
- Provide important information to you through the "Rights and Responsibilities" disclosure

## AFFORDABLE TUITION PAYMENT PLANS

Why make a large payment each semester or borrow federal funds at high interest rates when you can spread your educational costs over a 10- or 12-month period? Southeastern's affordable monthly payment plans are available to all students and families, regardless of need or financial standing. ## HOW TO ENROLL

1. Click the button below to visit **SEU.afford.com**.
2. Under "Payment Plans," choose the appropriate academic year and program; click "Enroll."
3. Enter the requested information\* in steps 1 through 7.

\*Be sure to consult with your student financial services counselor for assistance in determining the payment plan amount required to satisfy your estimated account balance. Adjustments to the payment plan can easily be made as needed during the year by logging in to your account online or contacting your payment plan representative at 800.722.4867.
